

EAGLE RIVER-28, WOODRUFF-0




The 1950-1951 season of basketball opened with an expected defeat at the hands of Rhinelander, 67-32. The Red and Blue looked a little sharper against Phelps, their first conference tilt, defeating them 58-53. White Lake proved to be little less than a pushover, when the Eagles beat them by a score of 61-36. Our boys met their climax against a highly favored Three Lakes outfit, defeating the Bluejays in an overtime 53-39. Woodruff was an easy contest. The Eagles led all the way and finally emerged with a 45-34 win. Wabeno proved to be a scrappy team, not easily defeated. The game was tight and low scoring, with the Logrollers coming from way behind to score seven points in the last two minutes. They were subdued, however by the local five to a tune of 35-34. Laurie Guth was the hero of the game. After five straight victories, an over confident Eagle quintet met their equal in an inspired, "Hot" Minocqua five, and were handed their first conference defeat by a score of 59-51. The last tilt before Christmas saw an easy victory over Goodman 66-52. After Christmas a lowly Laona five gave our boys a good battle and went down fighting by a score of 55-48. The second stunning upset of the season came from a hot Woodruff five. They could not seem to "miss" the hoop and subdued the local cagers 57-52. In a rematch with Three Lakes, the Eagles overcame the Bluejays early lead to stop the powerful champions for the second time, 55-49. A third upset came to the local cagers when Elcho handed them an unexpected defeat, 52-43. Elcho had a tall, aggressive, well coached outfit this year. The next duel was expected to be a tough one, and rightly so. After leading by a narrow margin the entire game, our first five fouled out slowly, and the subs, who did surprisingly well, could not hold the Minocqua quintet down and we lost, 52-51. The Red and Blue trounced Crandon in a slow, deliberate game, 47-35. Phelps proved to be a stubborn match, but finally yielded to the time of 63-53.

This game ended the conference schedual of E.R.H.S. We ended up with a record of ten wins and four losses which gave us an undisputed second in the conference. Our last game of the season was lost to Rhinelander 35-63. We played White Lake in the Jamboree and lost to a much improved squad, 62-43.
