



We strive for her approval but fear her disapprobation.


It is Miss Austin who will remain the most remembered and respected member of the faculty. Yes, Miss Austin is far more than a teacher and an advisor.

Mary Gaffney, Sandra Bellman, Betty Prince and Carole Froelich attended the University of Wisconsin Editors Conference with Mr. Check.


On May 24, 1963 to the tune of "Largo" we marched up to receive our diplomas.







At the end of the skiing season, a night skiing party is usually held at the Chanticleer Inn.


