**Mr. Win Abney**


As the Senior Class of 1964, we consider it an honor and a privilege to dedicate our annual, The Northern Trail, to Mr. Win Abney, our administrator.



Several improvements were completed at Eagle River High School during the 1963-1964 school year. Also a new class was added and several were enlarged.

Increased enthusiasm in the foreign language departments of the high school will necessitate a first year Latin class again in the school year of 1964-1965. The old library was transformed into a language laboratory for the French classes equipped with several new tape recorders. This helps teach the conversational aspect of the language. One new class was added this year. This class was natehand, a one semester class which teaches proper study habits as well as the use of shorthand for taking notes.

In the girls' locker room a new basket installation and remodeled shower facilities added to efficiency. New benches were also added for the girls' comfort.

The new teachers' lounge provide a place for teachers to go when they do not have classes or other responsibilities. Men and ladies' rest rooms are features of this addition.

The increased needs of the hot lunch program necessitated the use of two lunch lines and more modern facilities in the kitchen.

New business machines including a calculator and six new typewriters were added to the commercial department's already capable facilities.

The increased enrollment in this school year is expected to continue in the coming years. However, this should cause little or no problem in the near future since facilities are more than sufficient to handle the present number of students.

The freshmen presented "Where Are the Report Cards," also a comedy. Mr. Hanson supervised the cast.







The Eagle River Eagles had an exciting NLC race from the first game with Crandon to the last with the new VLC member, Florence.




The '63 Eagle squad set two school records. At Elcho, they held the Hornets to minus eight yards. This is the first time Eagle River has held a team to minus yardage.


