
The organizations at school complete the crown of glory for us students. The companionship and association with other students rounds out the qualities that make for the whole student.

We Eagles reigned victorious on the sports field. With four Northern Lakes Conference championship teams the crown of victory is worn with pride.




The end of the year brings for us seniors our final victory. Our crown of achievement is put aside in anticipation of even greater victories.


DEDICATION





This year our administration has been very active instituting improvements in the high school. A re-modeling program has already been started.

In addition to the newly painted blue walls and new light fixtures; new locks were installed in the 1924 section of the building, the old wood desks of the teachers have been replaced with modern metal desks. An accoustical ceiling has been constructed in the guidance counselor's office along with the addition of new draperies and carpeting.

Future improvements include new showers in the boys' locker room, and additional darkening drapes as a film viewing aid. Newly-designed band uniforms were purchased this year. A teacher who previously worked only half a day has been employed full-time to accommodate the influx of new students. A fourth year of French has been added to supplement the French III class instituted last year. Striving to offer students courses to prepare them for adult life, a Civil Defense class for seniors was taught by Mr. Abney on an experimental basis. Even the old routes were revised for better service.

Our board is constantly searching for ways to improve our school plant and the educational equipment and offerings of our school. Their interest in the operation of Eagle River Union High School has resulted in an institution of which we may all be very proud.




MATHEMATICS


SCIENCE














