





We smile knowingly to ourselves at the bewildered freshmen, and our scheming minds work overtime in planning initiation stunts. Our advisors this year are Mrs. Check, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Killinger, and Mr. Roth. We elect John Yadro, Jim Perry, Doug Orlich, and Melanie Pieniazek as our officers, and Kathy Froelich and Bill Frederick as our Student Council representatives. Jackie Abney, Julie Carter, Mike Maki, Andrea Wroblewski, Kathie Trinka, Vickie Richmond, Kathy Winder, and John Yadro are the actors. Our team wins the class basketball tournaments — quite a distinction for the sophomore athletes. The Pep Club sponsored basketball free throw contest is won by Joel Wollum. Doug Orlich earns the right to become a member of "E" Club this year.

At last we are upper classmen. We've waited a long time for this distinction! We start the school year with elections, choosing Jim Perry, Roberta Morgan, Al Hobbs, and Barb Camp as our junior class officers. Barb Alexander and Doug Orlich are chosen as members of the Students Council. Julie Carter and Louise Gubala represent our class in district forensics at Crandon, and Julie also participates in Stevens Point and in Madison. Bill Frederick, Barb Alexander, and Ron Inberg are elected as members of the National Honor Society this year. Vickie Richmond and Julie Carter are named as 1966-1967 editors of Hi-Times, and Kathy Froelich, Jodie Rismon, and Bill Frederick are named co-editors of the Northern Trail, and they all work doubly hard to prove themselves deserving of the honor. This is a year for sports. The Eagles demonstrate their football skill by winding up the season with a 6 and 1 record and a co-championship with Elcho. The basketball season ends with a 17-0 record, and two of our Juniors, Ron Inberg and Joel Wollum form a vital part of the invincible front five. Several Juniors also earn their letters in sports. At the end of the year, Vickie Richmond, Barb Alexander, and Kathy Froelich participate in the Badger Girls' State program, and representing our school at Badger Boys' State are Doug Orlich, Joel Wollum, Karl Schmidt, Alan Hobbs, and Jerry Sparks.

It's with mixed feelings of sadness and joy that we walk here for our last year. We are the smallest class in number, but we retain the spirit of "Almighty Seniors" as we work towards our goal. This year we choose Ron Inberg, Doug Orlich, Carol Kuran, and Bill Frederick as our class officers, and Melanie Pieniazek and Jerry Sparks as Student Council members. Our advisors in our Senior year are Mrs. Invie, Miss Austin, Mr. Check, Mr. Kozel, Mr. Ruppe, and Mr. Abney. We rise to glory and take first place in Homecoming float competition with our theme "Rulers of the Universe", breaking the long-standing Junior tradition. In spite of the rain, the traditional Victory Dance is held with "Fly Me to the Moon" as the central theme. Bill Maines and Cindy Chart are the reigning royalty. We take second place in the local One-Act play contest, when we present "Romance Is a Racket" starring Jackie Abney, Kathie Trinka, Louise Gubala, Julie Carter, Karl Schmidt, Mike Maki and Vickie Richmond. It is directed by Mrs. Invie. Our class sends several students to Goodman for participation in the district forensics meet. 

After a fast start with four straight victories, the Eagles hit a mid-year slump and lost three games in a row, but ended the year on a happy note with a final victory over Crandon. The season record for Eagle River was five victories and three defeats.

Eagle River "won" the battle of the statistics, outscoring their opponents, 124 to 69; out-gaining them 1,884 yards to 1,334 yards; intercepted more passes, 7 to 6, made more first downs, 80 to 73; and, unfortunately, was penalized more frequently, 56 times for 504 yards as compared to our opponents 35 times for 407 yards.

The games showed many instances of individual outstanding play, but as a team the Eagles gave indications of championship quality.






Two new girls are chosen from the Freshman class each year and remain on the squad through their senior year. They then receive a letter and four gold bars signifying four years of cheering.







Decked out in their new uniforms, the members of the band created a spectacular sight during Homecoming. All members were proud to wear these new uniforms.






