**CLASS HISTORY**

The school board has been very cooperative with the student council and has achieved many important accomplishments during this past year. Some of these accomplishments are briefly explained in the following paragraph.



The 1969 football season at Eagle River High School was predicted by many to be an off year. Many people mentioned that the Eagles just didn't have it in "69".

On August 13, Coach Chuck Hanke and the Eagles began practice with the firm belief that the skeptics were wrong. By the end of the season there was no doubt in anyone's mind that the team had proven itself. The Eagles won the Northern Lakes Conference Championship by outscoring their opponents 196 to 20. This was the best defensive record and second best offensive record in the conference.

Although they started off the season on a sour note by playing poorly and losing to Suring 21-6 in a non-conference game, they rolled to seven straight victories in the conference. The championship was the first for Eagle River since 1965 when they shared the title with Elcho.

The two games which will stick out in everyone's mind are the wins over Laona and Wabeno. The Laona Kellys (who finished second in the conference) came into the Eagles Homecoming game undefeated in a duel for first place. The Eagles won the game by scoring three touchdowns in the first half and shutting out the Kellys all the way.

When the Wabeno Logrollers came to town they weren't supposed to be very rough, but they almost upset the Eagles. Only a fourth quarter touchdown pass from Tim McIntosh to Mike Shields and a 42 yard fieldgoal by Jerry Grubel cinched the title for the Eagles. With the win against Wabeno the Eagles have a 12 game winning streak at home dating back to 1966.

The Eagles put the amazing number of three players on the All-Conference team. They were halfback Craig Vogel, guard Jim Stopczynski, and tackle Jerry Grubel. They also had Gary Heeler (center), Tim McIntosh (quarterback), Mike Eickhoff (tackle) and Veryl Krosschell (end) receive honorable mention for All-Conference honors.



The team named Jerry Grubel Most Valuable Player and Craig Vogel Captain for the "69" season.



Each year, through a lot of hard work and effort, the Eagle River High School Chorus has been a Class A performing group.


