Members are chosen by a group of faculty members and are judged on their qualities of leadership, character, service, scholastic abilities and honor.




If you went to any of the home basketball games this year, you surely saw the Pom-Pom girls perform. And judging from the response, they must have been exceptional performances.

one alternate. These girls usually practiced three nights a week, but it often came to four or five nights to make sure they had at least one new routine per game.



The long awaited day of October 9th, 1970 finally arrived. After weeks of looking at campaign posters and signs sporting slogans such as, "All the Way With Mary K," "Vote 'Turtles'," "Don't be Blue--Vote for Sue", "Vote Dana Jean for HC Queen", and "Lotsa Luck Backs Linda, Why Don't You?", the ERHS students faced the tough decision of who to vote for to be the 1970 Homecoming Queen. Of the five girls, it was impossible to tell who deserved it the most. The tension, anticipation, and the excitement had been building up in the girls for weeks, and were now reaching their peak.

Then, after watching and wondering for a whole day, the five candidates walked into the big gym for the eighth hour pep rally which was the first event in the chain of Homecoming festivities. As Coach Hanke announced that the captain for the game and the 1970 Homecoming King was to be Eddie Carter, yelling and cheering arose from the bleachers. The King Eddie introduced the candidates one by one, and each girl stepped out onto the floor with shaking legs. The abrupt, brief announcement by the King that Linda Richter would be the 1970 Homecoming Queen seemed to break all the strings of tension--and applause and excitement poured forth as she was mobbed, hugged, and kissed by the other girls. When everyone deserted her, the stunned Queen started to follow--but then stopped and managed to say, "What can I say? Thanks!--And we're going to win!"

At the end of the pep rally, students proudly lined up behind their floats, based on TV slogans, which had taken a lot of time and effort to design and make. The King, Queen, and their court arranged themselves in the convertibles that would carry them through town in the parade. Even though the weather was dreary, the parade went on in full spirit.

The first float in the procession was the Frosh's float, "You Can Take Eagles Out of the Fight, But--You Can't Take the Fight Out of the Eagles." This consisted of an Eagle squashing a Bobcat under its foot while running out of the end zone with a football. On the sidelines, two dead Bobcats showed what the Eagles' strength can do. They grabbed a third for their idea.

The Sophomore float, which placed fourth in judging,

sported the theme, "We're No. 'Un". A red, white, and blue Eagle was drinking a can of 7-Up with a very small Bobcat looking on.

The No. 1 float--designed and built by the Juniors was composed of a red, white, and blue Eagle kicking a Bobcat into a trash can. It was a good-natured hint because it had the theme, "Keep America Beautiful".

The last float the Seniors would ever make together, "Breakfast of Champions," placed second in judging. A large red, white, and Blue Eagle was eating a bowl of Bobcats with a large spoon.

Towards the end of the parade, the clouds let rush forth a rainburst, which washed everything clean, including the paper napkins. Later on in the evening, the sun broke through and smiled for about half an hour before it set. That assured us of a cool, but rainless night.

The band put on a sincere and enthusiastic pre-game and half-time show that had taken many weeks of practice to learn the marching patterns as well as coordinating them with their music.

As it has seemed to be a tradition in the Eagle's Homecoming games, they swamped the 'Cats' by a score of 40-6.

Then the time for the dance and the crowning of the King and Queen arrived. Couples danced to the music of "Pride and Freedom" until 11:00 when the Grand March began. The five couples walked the "hesitation march" in a pattern before taking their places. With two couples on each side, the fifth couple stood in the center. Janis Croker, Pep Club president, said the honored words, and crowned Eddie Carter Homecoming King of 1970. Eddie then took the remaining crown, and crowned the kneeling Linda Richter Homecoming Queen of 1970. The couple then stepped on the decorated risers and the Queen was presented with a football autographed by the Senior Eagles and a bouquet of flowers, which she shared with the members of the court. They then led the court to dance and eventually everyone joined in.

For many, especially the King and Queen, the day had been altogether too short, but many treasured memories would always be locked within their hearts.
