


An elite group in our high school is the Greggsters. This club is entered only through skill in shorthand, not by desire. Only those in their 2nd year of shorthand may be members.

After many days of preparation, having used some of the best literature, writings, and current information available, the local forensic contest was held on March 4, 1968.

Following the local competition, the contestants traveled to Elcho to compete at the sub-district level on March 12.

In forensic competition, everyone "won" a rating. Whether this rating was an A, B, or C, participants agreed that the experience itself provided a great deal of satisfaction.

The students who received A's at the sub-district level earned the right to compete at the district level. On March 30, 1968, Bonnie Sarkauskas, Karen Weber, Mimi Olson, Jerry Abney, Bruce McMurry, Herb Numrich, Tim McIntosh and Robert Perk arrived at the scene of the district contest held in Stevens Point.

The final contest in high school forensics was the state contest held in Madison. This competition brought the participants a reward for their hard work — a medal as a symbol of their achievement.



ONE-ACT PLAYS







Coach Hanke and his assistants, Mr. Freymiller and Mr. Mangseth, can be proud of the 1967 football squad.


